Student Restraint and Isolation Feedback

WEA members are reporting serious concerns with severe and frequent student behavioral outbursts that can put student and staff safety in jeopardy and disrupt classroom learning. Washington lawmakers have talked a lot in the last year about student isolation and restraint policies but their discussions are incomplete – they badly need to hear from educators who work in the buildings and interact with students.
