

# Vancouver Education Association VEA National Board Candidate Support Cohort Program 2025-26

VEA provides facilitated support for candidates going through the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards certification process. Candidate support is optional for teachers completing their National Boards; however, teacher candidates who are part of a support program show a significantly higher passing rate.

As part of a cohort, candidates receive support, instruction, and feedback from their trained facilitators who are VEA colleagues. Examples include: "unpacking" the National Board component prompts, finding evidence of National Board standards, and ensuring alignment. Clock hours will be available.

Where are cohort meetings held? C1-C4 courses will be held at VSAA in the media center. Foundations course will be held in-person at the VEA office (2509 Broadway St – Vancouver, WA 98663).

What is the cost? Candidates pay a registration fee of \$100 to finalize and confirm their place in the cohort. Candidates also pay support fees based on Components selected. If you attended the WEA Jump Start Program, you do not need to take the Foundations Course.

Participants will be charged for any sessions that occur prior to notification of withdrawal.

- VEA Cohort Support for C1, C2, C3, C4 (offered by Vancouver Education Association)

If a candidate signs up for the National Board process between September 2025 and November 2026, at a minimum, they will have access to the following types of support:
