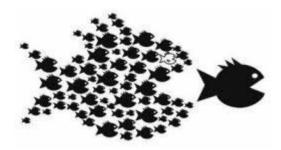

Organizing Together Change Happens!

VEA is very thankful for our members and the amazing job you do every day. We recognize you are working with some enormous class sizes and serving more students with complex

needs. You are spread very thin and yet provide amazing student experiences, many times at a personal cost. Our contract allows for an interim bargain to occur this year to address non-monetary contractual changes and salary for 2026-27, the final year of this contract. The district is also currently operating extremely close to the red line financially, which is another hurdle to overcome.

We know there is power in numbers, and when we stand up together as a group of over 1450 members, we achieve great things. Our union membership gives us the strength to do things we cannot do separately. While VEA leaders and staff voice concerns and suggestions to the district, they listen but sometimes are reluctant to act. When members en masse speak out, we see action happen! We are seeing real changes this year in Special Services following nearly 100% participation in previous climate surveys and a vote of no confidence. VEA is a member-driven organization. To achieve a strong bargain, we are going to need your help...

What can you do?

• Watch for the VEA bargaining survey link via email on November 7th and complete it no later than December 19. Results provide the team with priorities, ideas and strategies. Data provides the VEA team with some clout to push for change.



• **Speak up!** Let the School Board (and the community) know your realities with overload. Share ideas for cost saving measures *outside of personnel*. VEA can assist in providing guidance for speaking at the School Board and how to elevate your voices. Multiple speakers amplify the message.



VOTE! Retain pro-public education, pro-labor candidates as your key decision makers for VPS. School Board Candidates Wendy Smith and Sandra Zavala-Ortega as well as Anne McEnery-Ogle (Mayor), Kim Harless (City Council Pos 1), Erik Paulsen (City Council Pos 2), and Diana Perez (City Council Pos 3) were endorsed by WEAPAC.

VEBA Yearly Vote

VEA members who are eligible to retire at the end of this school year have the opportunity to vote to receive the benefit for their unused sick leave via a VEBA account. Likewise members who have accumulated 180 days (1440 hours) of sick leave can elect to contribute additionally to their VEBA account with a yearly cash out of accumulated sick leave.

A link to an electronic vote will be sent to these specific members identified by the district as qualifying for this vote. Votes due by noon on November 14th. An informational Zoom meeting is scheduled for 4:30 pm on November 13th with a VEBA rep to answer questions. Please Register in advance for Zoom access.

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October 15 – July 15	During the period October 15 to July 15 a vacancy will be externally posted for a minimum of five (5) working days to allow maximum opportunity for in-District and out-of-District candidates to make an application. (7.3A)
November 1	The district will make every reasonable effort to implement the advancement of all individuals on the salary schedule at one time, on or before the November 1 payroll. (11.19B)
November (within 90 days of first date of service)	New employees will be evaluated at least once for 30 minutes within 90 calendar days of employment. Preliminary reports due in human resources no later than 105 calendar days from the first date of service. (8.4Lvii)
November (within 90 days of first date of service)	Employees NEW to the TRS system in Washington state have 90 days to choose between TRS2 and TRS3 retirement plan. TRS2 is the default plan if you do not choose.

SEBB Open Enrollment Oct 27-Nov 24 DO NOT WAIT UNTIL THE LAST MINUTE!!

Open Enrollment for SEBB insurance began October 27, 2025, and ends November 24, 2025, with changes effective January 1, 2026. Information about upcoming changes for 2025 are now posted on the SEBB open enrollment website. (https://www.hca.wa.gov/employee-retiree-benefits/open-enrollment-sebb)

Reminder – if you want to participate in a Flexible Spending Account (FSA) or in the Dependent Care Assistance Program (DCAP) for the 2026 plan year, you must re-enroll during the Open Enrollment period.
